


The MAK & its's mission

The MAK is the second oldest museum of applied art in the world. Founded in 1863 as the Imperial Royal Austrian Museum of Art and Industry with the aim of serving as both a sample collection and an educational and training institution, it represents the fruitful combination of past and future, of applied and fine art. Ranging from the Middle Ages to the present day, our collection's outstanding examples of artistic creativity run the gamut from applied art, design, architecture, and fashion to contemporary fine and digital art.

We believe in the power of creativity.

The MAK approaches its core missions—collecting, researching, and educating in the context of the forward-thinking and sustainable development of our society and environment. Our narrative revolves around the impact and power of art and design, and how our understanding of history can enable us to tap into this in response to the challenges of both the present and the future.

With our wide range of topics and educational formats we aim to start a socially relevant and lively dialogue with a broad and diverse public, whom we welcome to our museum. The MAK Vienna Collections

LIBRARY & WORKS ON PAPER COLLECTION

The MAK owns one of the oldest museum libraries in the world. The Works on Paper Collection belonging to it provided templates for the Secession, the Hagenbund, and the Wiener Werkstätte. To this day, the collection of international designs in books and graphics serves as a source of ideas for designers, architects, and artists. For scientists, the Library and the freely accessible Reading Room are a place of accumulated knowledge on applied art.

TEXTILES & CARPET COLLECTION

From pre-Christian textile fragments from Peru to medieval tapestries to cashmere shawls and contemporary fashion—the MAK Textiles and Carpets Collection offers a comprehensive cross-section of different eras, regions, and techniques. As a material archive, it reflects not only artistic, but also technical and economic developments—and therefore predominantly global cultural interconnections of the last 1,500 years.

DESIGN COLLECTION

The collection, first established in 2005, represents a multifaceted range of contemporary design and is based on an expanded concept of design with a focus on society, ecology, and technology. The collection includes objects and design strategies ranging from industrial serial production and handmade prototypes to social design processes and design using digital technologies.

GLAS & CERAMICS COLLECTION

With exceptional holdings from the Middle Ages to the present, the MAK Glass and Ceramics Collection is one of the world's most important collections of its kind. The aesthetically and technically impressive products made of fragile materials bring to life the individual artistic style and the zeitgeist of the respective epoch.

CONTEMPORARY ART COLLECTION

The circa 1,500 works, work groups and bundles of documentation contained in this collection encompass the areas of fine art and architecture.

METAL COLLECTION & WIENER WERKSTÄTTE ARCHIV




From corncob holders to trellis gates, from an amputation saw to Alessi cutlery: The MAK Metal Collection preserves objects of all sizes, from almost all eras, and for needs that are no longer known. Contemporary jewelry from Austria is an important focus. Furthermore, the archive of the Wiener Werkstätte gives an account of the success and failure of a world-famous design company around 1900.

ASIA COLLECTION

The MAK Asia Collection consists of around 25,000 objects from countries outside of Europe (East Asia, Southeast Asia, the Arab-Islamic cultural region) and presents a wide selection from the fields of fine and decorative arts from the Neolithic period to the present. Europe's material culture has always developed in exchange with Asia. The MAK Asia Collection documents the traces of these intercultural processes of dialogue.

FURNITURE & WOODWORK COLLECTION

The MAK owns an extensive Furniture and Woodwork Collection, based on which the artistic and stylistic tendencies of the history of furniture—with a focus on Austria and Vienna—as well as the socio-political developments of the past 150 years can be traced. The Collection encompasses around 5,000 objects ranging from small carvings and delicate boxes to massive cabinets and entire interior designs.





